

Library use of the Dublin Core metadata-system

The issue of my presentation is to examine the possibilities of using the Dublin Core metadata-system in libraries. The system was created in a OCLC seminary in March 1995 where the members arranged about the main elements of the describing records of the Internet documents.

Appearing of the computers the life changed at all points, so did in the libraries. One of these changes is the handling of the electronic documents in libraries. From the aspect of the processing of the distant attainment documents is bigger problem than the local electronic documents.

Lots of different metadata-systems were developed for processing the electronic documents. One of these is the Dublin Core system. The developers and the users of the Dublin Core system decided that the creation of the national indexation rules of electronic publications would be based on the FRBR study of the IFLA. Because of this, I think, it's necessary to compare the Dublin Core metadata-system with the FRBR model. I'm out to make clear the connection between the two systems, and I try to match the elements of the Dublin Core system with the elements of the FRBR model.
